

Ancient History 10 Outcomes

Students will be investigating the following units and are expected to meet the curricular outcomes associated with each by the end of the semester:

Birth of Civilizations

BC 1 Demonstrate awareness and understanding of the chronology of human development and historical periods.

BC2 Demonstrate an understanding of the characteristics that define ancient civilizations.

BC3 Develop an awareness of the fundamental needs of people to form groups and establish structures which validate and nurture civilizations.

BC4 Demonstrate and understanding of the different regions of the ancient world and be able to explain their various contributions.

BC5 Evaluate historic events and human accomplishments of Greece and Rome and two other civilizations. E.G. Mesopotamia, Egypt, India, China, Hebrews, Persia, etc

Political Structures

2.1 Investigate the source of governance that developed from prehistory to the Fall of the Roman Empire.

2.2 Investigate political structures to determine the interdependent relationship between distinct polities while recognizing cultural, racial and ethnic diversity.

2.3 Demonstrate the connection between governmental systems and their impact on economic development and class diversity.

2.44 Explore how modern political systems/structures have evolved from early political origins.

2.5 Examine how political power and authority have been used to create both social cohesion and conflict.

Empires

E1 Demonstrate an understanding of the factors that gave rise to empires.

E2 Investigate the socio-economic factors that led to the development of imperialist exploitation within an empire.

E3 Identify the strengths and weaknesses of at least two empires from selected case studies.

E4 Explore a range of 'voices' of constituencies from within the empires through the use of primary source material.

E5 Evaluate the impact and influences of ancient empires and imperialism on contemporary societies through politics, culture, technological advancements or economies.

Religions and Civilizations

RR1 Identify the impact religion has had on the development of human culture.

RR2 Investigate the relationship between religion and historical events.

RR3 Evaluate the impact religion and ancient history has had on modern society.

Revolutions

R1 Demonstrate a historical understanding of the concept of revolution throughout history in relation to influences of cultural, racial, ethnic and commercial factors.

R2 Compare and contrast how various revolutionary activity has either benefited or hindered societal elements.

R3 Evaluate through analysis the impact of revolution on those that govern and those that are governed.
